

Maximum of 2 adults and 2 children under 10 per Quintrex boat, and a maximum of 4 people per Pontoon boat.
Your rental time begins when you leave the beach with the boat. Any delay will incur an additional charge.
Any accident must be reported upon return.

You are renting a boat as part of a regulated tourist activity, and certain rules must be followed:

FOR YOUR SAFETY (and the safety of others!)

Never smoke on board. The consumption of alcohol or drugs before or during navigation is strictly prohibited.
The sunshade is fragile, do not try to lower it. Please do not hang on to it when getting on or off the boat.
While navigating, please stay within the passenger area and do not lean over the edge of the boat.
No jumping allowed.
Always turn off the engine before leaving the boat, and only restart it once everyone is back on board.
Joining any group involved in lagoon activities is strictly forbidden.

NAVIGATION & ENVIRONMENTAL RESPECT

Navigation outside the lagoon is strictly prohibited.
For your safety, do not approach the reef closer than 800 meters.
No stopping is allowed at docks or pontoons, whether belonging to hotels or restaurants (respect private property, risk of damage or injury in case of a fall).
Please maintain a **minimum distance of 50 meters from other boats and swimmers**.
Always anchor in sandy areas & Do not cross coral areas with the boat.
Follow the route indicated on the map (yellow markings).
Do not throw any waste into the lagoon or onto the beach.
Do not touch coral: it takes 100 years to regenerate! (Also beware of infections).
Fishing, regardless of the method (line, spearfishing, harpoon, etc.), is not allowed with rental boats.
Please do not feed wildlife and maintain a minimum distance of 3 meters from marine animals.

MANTA RAY, STINGRAY AND SHARK SITES

**Any presence at manta ray or shark sites will result in a fine of 30,000 XPF,
as well as the immediate termination of the activity.**

Manta ray and shark observation sites must only be accessed under the supervision of a professional guide.
If access to these sites is not permitted, it is because they are regulated by the municipality of Bora Bora, under an agreement between all operators working on the lagoon. These measures are part of a sustainable ecotourism approach aimed at limiting tourist pressure on wildlife and preserving reefs.
These provisions are based on the Environmental Code of French Polynesia (Articles LP.2111-1 and following), as well as regulations concerning protected areas.

PRIVATE AREAS

All motus (islets) are private, except for the beach indicated on your map.
No stopping is allowed at hotels (not even the beach or pontoon, even if you're a guest).
The use of drones is regulated. Photography and video are under responsibility.

IN CASE OF EMERGENCY (To unlock the phone, press the top left button on the keypad, then press the star key *)
